

**FENWICK SCHOLAR PROGRAM**  
**Instructions for Application**  
(2006-07)

The candidate should submit a narrative including full information of the following items:

1. Project title.
2. Description of the project. This includes a statement of the problem, the method of analysis, a review of relevant literature and – if appropriate – the grounding hypothesis and feasibility.
3. Detailed budget (if assistance is needed) and evidence of financial feasibility within maximum allowable stipend. (Up to \$4,000 may be awarded to carry out the Fenwick Program.)
4. Plan for Fourth Year of Study with a timeline for project development and completion.
5. Course preparation for the project.
6. Expected benefits from the Fenwick year.

**This application should be accompanied by:**

1. Fenwick Scholar Application Cover Sheet
2. A term paper, essay, or other relevant project which illustrates writing ability or previous work in the area of proposed Fenwick research.
3. Your transcript.

**You should also arrange for the following letters to be sent to the Director of CISS by the deadline for proposals:**

4. Supporting letters from two advisors for your project.
5. A supporting letter from the nominating department chair or chairs in the case of double majors who wish to receive credit from both departments.

**This year's due date for proposals to the Director of CISS is Monday, March 26, 2007. On-campus interviews and teleconference interviews for students abroad will be held in April, date to be determined. Twelve copies of your proposal and associated documents are required.**
