

## **The John D. O'Connell Prize for Accounting Excellence**

Members of the class of 2009 currently majoring in Economics/Accounting are invited to apply for the John D. O'Connell Prize for Accounting Excellence. The prize, established in 1994 recognizes an outstanding junior Economics/Accounting major.

The award was established to honor the long-standing service of the College's distinguished accounting professor, John D. O'Connell. Applicants for the prize must have an excellent academic record, a record of meaningful service to the College community and a demonstrated interest in the profession of public accounting. The College's accounting faculty will review the applications and select this year's recipient. The prize includes a cash purse and an engraved desk set. Announcement of the winner will be made at the accounting banquet later this semester.
