Holy Cross. The Department of Sociology and Anthropology at the College of the Holy Cross invites applications for a new tenure-track position in sociology to begin in late August 2008. We seek candidates whose primary teaching and research interests include one or more of the following: law, medical sociology, environmental sociology. The successful candidate will show promise or evidence of teaching excellence, a record of scholarly achievement, and commitment to service. This position carries a 3-2 teaching load with a full salary one-semester research leave prior to tenure review. Holy Cross is a highly selective, Jesuit liberal arts college of 2,700 students. The department will be comprised of ten professionally active sociologists, four cultural anthropologists, and roughly 200 majors. Candidates are expected to have completed the Ph.D. by the time of appointment.
