



THE HOLY CROSS BANNER

The cross on the cover of this program is taken from the banner behind the altar today. A gift of the Holy Cross Jesuit Community for the 1997 Baccalaureate Mass, the banner was designed by John Buscemi and fabricated by Judy Dioszegi and Debbie Vicino. The same design appears several times in the College's Mary Chapel.

The cross, from which the College derives its name, is central to the life of this community. The cross depicted today has four quadrants representing four years of college, and reflect the different times of life echoed in the four seasons. Just as the cross was the passageway from death to life for Jesus, so the center of this cross is an invitation to the many passages that college offers. The ends of the cross expand beyond the edges of the banner, inviting those who have lived under this sign to go out into the world as "men and women for and with others."
