The “little purple book” published years ago speaks to this. It was created by the College’s Mission and Identity Subcommittee, which was chaired by Rev. Paul F. Harman, S.J., vice president for mission.

This diminutive volume — about the size of a cell phone — belies a wealth of knowledge. It’s become such a commodity that it has earned the distinction of being “the most stolen book on campus.” Weighing less than half a pound, the book nevertheless anchors our shared values — offering an overview of St. Ignatius of Loyola, Jesuit education, the Spiritual Exercises and Jesuit spirituality. It also includes a condensed history of Holy Cross, all framed by our College’s mission.

One of my favorite passages in the book’s narrative is this:

*“The ultimate goal of Jesuit education is to lead individuals to the discovery of God’s presence in all things and all people. Jesuit education sees the human mind as something given to us by God for important tasks. It should never be the case that reason is scorned or put aside, because the love of God and the desire for knowledge are two sides of the same coin.”*

Like the martlets in our College’s great seal, our mission is to ceaselessly soar. This is why we continuously aspire toward academic excellence, access and affordability, and transformational student experience — to advance the College’s spirit by achieving communion with the human and the divine.





