




For the following images used at the procession of the Gifts:

- In a mixed Muslim and Christian neighborhood of Abidjan, Ivory Coast, young people from a Jesuit parish reenact the Passion in the streets on Good Friday.
- Women praying for healing at Matridham (Abode of the Mother) Ashram, a Catholic Charismatic center near the Hindu holy city of Banaras, India.
- In Yunnan, China, close to the borders of Myanmar, ethnic Tibetan Catholics gather for the Easter vigil.
- Manila's Black Nazarene Feast draws as many as 9 million devotees, mostly young people, to the streets over the course of 24 hours each January.
- Families approach the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe to celebrate her feast, often having traveled for days to be there, bringing their own images of her to be blessed.
- Young girls in Ouro Preto, Brazil join a huge procession on Easter morning walking along dazzling colored sawdust "carpets" they create in the streets from midnight until dawn.

The images carried in the procession and the languages we will hear spoken in prayer remind us that we are part of a remarkably global Church, and celebrate Holy Cross' commitment to educating our students and the wider community about the full reality and diversity of Catholicism today.
