### **Community Service Work-Study**

The Office of Government and Community Relations (GCR) coordinates the community service work-study program. GCR provides academic year and summer community service employment opportunities for currently enrolled students who receive a work-study award as part of their financial aid package. The jobs allow HC students to help meet the needs of the community and to earn income through engaging and rewarding work. (First-year students are not eligible.) Community-based learning (CBL) is a teaching approach that connects classroom learning objectives with civic engagement. Civic engagement occurs through service that meets community-identified needs or through research and experience that holds promise of social or scientific value to the community. In this mutually beneficial process, students are able to gain a deeper understanding of course content by integrating theory with practice, while communities gain access to volunteers, resources, and the wide-ranging research and scholarly expertise housed in the College's many disciplinary departments.
