### **Notes**

- Course overlaps. To promote multidisciplinary inquiry, the Center for Interdisciplinary Study (CIS), who oversees LALC, has established these rules for counting the same course for more than one program of study:
  - (i) a CIS concentration (or minor) may overlap a maximum of 2 courses from all other plan(s) of study;
  - (ii) a CIS major may overlap a maximum of 2 courses from another plan of study (e.g., your other major) or 3 courses from two other plans of study (e.g., your other major and a different minor);
  - (iii) No single course may count for three plans of study.
- ▶ Exceptions to the "two course" rule per department. Normally, no more than two courses from any one department may count towards a LALC program of study. In the case of courses taken in the Spanish department, however, three may be accepted if one deals with art content, specifically SPAN 312 (Filmmaking in Spanish), SPAN 420 (Latin American Film) and SPAN 366 (Creative Writing in Spanish).
- A gateway course is a course with a broad focus on Latin America. Courses that have been used to satisfy this requirement include, but are not limited to, the ones listed below. Please consult with the LALCS program director for more information.

A course may count towards more than one requirement. For instance, ANTH 266, POLS 251, CISS 299 (US and Latin America) may fulfill the Gateway requirement, may count as one of the four courses from four different departments at a 200 level, and the research and writing intensive requirement. A total of ten courses for the major or six for the concentration is still required.

### **APPLICATION PROCEDURES**

### **Concentrators**

You may declare a LALC concentration at any time. To declare the concentration:

On the STAR system, under My Academics, click on the Change of Academic Plan. Under the Student Forms and Flows heading, click on Declare Major/Minor/Concentration and follow the instructions for declaring the concentration.

### **Majors**

After preparing your plans with the Director of LALC, you should plan to meet with the Director of the Center for Interdisciplinary Studies. Then, you may begin completing the CIS Major Application form. <u>Links to the form</u> and more information are available on the CIS website.

The **application portal** for these forms opens on the first day of classes and there is one deadline each semester when all of your materials must be submitted.

- ▶ In the fall semester, the deadline is the first Friday in October.
- ▶ In the spring semester, the deadline is the second Friday in February.

Note: Students must have their major approved before they can do a Change of Academic Plan.
