This College, founded and placed by the late Right Reverend BENE-DICT JOSEPH FENWICK, Bishop of Boston, under the care of the Fathers of the Society of Jesus, is beautifully situated on the heights of Wor-cesters, commands a full view of the city and surrounding country, and is distinguished for its remarkable healthy air, and abundant supply of good water. A farm of ninety-six acres is attached to the College.

The plan of education is designed to prepare young men for an eccle-siastical, professional, or commercial state of life, and embraces

THREE DISTINCT COURSES OF STUDY.

The **COMMERCIAL COURSE** comprises

Writing, Arithmetic and Book-Keeping, the English and French lan-guages, History, Geography, and the use of the Globes, Elementary Algebra and Geometry, with the practical branches of Mathematics, English and French Composition, Reading and public Speaking, and the grounds of natural and revealed religion.

The **PROFESSIONAL COURSE** is as follows:

FIRST YEAR, RUDIMENTS.

Latin Grammar, Viri Romæ, Geography, English Grammar, Bible History, Latin and English exercises, Arithmetic.

SECOND YEAR, THIRD HUMANITIES.

Nepos, Cicero's Letters, Fables of Phædrus, Greek Grammar, Latin Grammar, English Grammar, Latin, Greek, and English Exercises, Æsop's Fables in Greek, Geography of North America, History of Greece and *Compendium* of the History of the United States, Arithmetic.

THIRD YEAR, SECOND HUMANITIES.

Curtius, Ovid's Metamorphosis, Græca Minora, History of Rome, Latin, Greek and English Grammar, Geography of South America and Europe. In the second term, Cæsar and Ovid's Tristium.

FOURTH YEAR, FIRST HUMANITIES.

Sallust, Virgil, Dialogues of Lucian, Geography of Asia and Africa, Ancient and Modern History, Mythology, Prosody, Latin and Greek Grammar, Scanning and Construction of Latin verse, Exercises in Latin, Greek, and English. Second term, Cicero's Minor Works, Virgil, Xenophon, Theocritus.

FIFTH YEAR, POETRY.

Livy, Virgil, Horace, (Art of Poetry,) Xenophon, Theocritus. Second term, Cicero's Orations, Horace, (Odes,) Catullus, Tibullus, and Propertius, Thucydides, Homer. Both terms, Precepts of Poetry and Rhetoric, Greek Dialects and Prosody, History of England, Ancient Geography. English, Latin, and Greek style particularly attended to in prose and poetry, and specimens from approved authors committed to memory.

SIXTH YEAR, RHETORIC.

Cicero's Orations, Horace, (Satires and Epistles,) Livy, Demosthenes, Homer. Second term, Cicero's Orations, Quintillian, Juvenal, Persius, Tacitus, Demosthenes, Sophocles. Both terms, Precepts of Rhetoric, History of the United States and of the Constitution of United States, History of Latin, Greek and English Literature. A greater, if possible, attention is paid to style, and orations are composed.

SEVENTH YEAR, PHILOSOPHY.

Logic, Metaphysics and Ethics,—Lectures on these branches are delivered in Latin, and a daily examination is held on the Lecture. Natural Philosophy, and Chemistry.

The ECCLESIASTICAL COURSE comprises, in addition to the branches mentioned above, the several departments of sacred learning, Biblical and Theological.

MATHEMATICS.

All the students sufficiently advanced, have an hour and a quarter, every day, allotted to the study of Mathematics.

In the lowest class are taught Algebra and the first books of Geometry.

In the next, Legendre, Plane Trigonometry, Surveying.

In the next, Analytical Geometry and Calculus.

There are three classes of French. During the whole course, the students are exercised in Composition and Declamation.

The religious and moral instruction of all, is attended to with watchful and anxious care. Besides the usual course of Catechetical instruction, public lectures are delivered on the principles, doctrines and ceremonies of the Catholic Church. All the Students, even in hours of recreation, are constantly under the special care and superintendence of one or more prefects or professors. No applicant from any other institution will be admitted without satisfactory testimonials as to character and conduct from the principal of that institution.

The books necessary for the different classes, may be furnished by parents or guardians, or they can be procured at the College at very moderate charges. All books must be admitted to the supervision of the prefect of schools.

Age of Admission, from nine to fifteen years. No Student admitted for a less term than six months, and no deduction made, if removed before the term expires.

The following items are extra charges. The German, Spanish and Italian languages, Music, Drawing, Painting, Dancing, Fencing, and Medical attendance.

All charges must be paid half yearly in *advance*. Should any defer for the space of *one month* to pay in advance, the President of the College is directed to remove their sons or wards from the institution.

No advance for clothing or other expenses will be made by the College, unless a deposit be left with the Treasurer; for the purpose.

Every Student must be provided with the uniform, namely; black frock coat or jacket, white pantaloons and vest in Summer, blue pantaloons and dark vest in Winter. No Student is to visit out of the College, without his uniform. All must be provided with two suits for daily wear, six shirts, six pairs of stockings, six pocket handkerchiefs, three pairs of shoes or boots, great coat or cloak. Each student must also be provided with a silver spoon.

Regular accounts of board, tuition, will be sent every six months in advance. It is earnestly requested that immediate remittances be made to the full amount.
