Biography/History:

Patrick Denn was born in 1756 and was from Coolroe, Ireland. He was a proscribed hedge schoolmaster, as was his father, Laurence. He is recorded as living in Affane in 1800, as well as in Cappoquin. One of his many pupils was Dr. John Power, Bishop of Waterford. Denn also taught Christian Doctrine, in Irish, in the church on Sundays. He wrote a number of books on Christianity including, Aigneas an Pheacaigleis an Mbas', 'Comhairle an Pheacaig agus aitheantha de Minighthe', and 'Stiurtatheoir an Pheacaig'. Denn died on 5 July 1828, at the age of 72.

Scope and Content Note:

This volume contains writings in Gaelic and 2 poems in English written by Patrick Denn.. It is unclear who the author of this volume is. The poem at the end of the volume is dated July 30th 1816 and there is a notation on the first page in Latin for the College of the Holy Cross. There are approximately 200 pages in the volume.
