Biography/History:

Robbins was probably a farmer in Kennebec Co., Maine as well as a storekeeper, mechanic, and a stable keeper. He was born in the year 1745 in Kennebec Co. but there was no record of his death.

Scope and Content Note:

Daniel Robbins' account book is 64 pages long and is a record of his financial activities. There are records of horses that Robbins loaned, worked he performed and items purchased and sold. The prices are given in shillings and pounds until 1800, when he switched to dollars and cents. Some of the Maine towns that are mentioned include Readfield, Monmouth, Vassalbow, and Sandy River. There are also included the notes about the account book that were written by Rev. William L. Lucey, S.J. The volume was donated to Holy Cross by William J. O'Connor '39 in October of 1966.
